This Service Animal Compliance Addendum (“Addendum”) is incorporated into and made part of the Facility Rental Agreement between Kora Shrine Temple and the above-named Renter.

1. Acknowledgment of Law

Renter acknowledges that Kora Shrine Temple complies with applicable federal and Maine law concerning Service Animals, including the Americans with Disabilities Act and the Maine Human Rights Act.

A Service Animal is defined as a dog (and in limited cases a miniature horse) that is individually trained to perform work or tasks for the benefit of an individual with a disability.

Animals whose sole function is to provide comfort, emotional support, companionship, or therapy are not considered Service Animals under public accommodation law.

2. Permitted Animals

- Service Animals accompanying individuals with disabilities are permitted in areas open to event attendees.
- No additional fee may be charged solely for the presence of a lawful Service Animal.
- Pets, emotional support animals, therapy animals, or comfort animals are not permitted unless expressly approved in writing by Kora Shrine Temple management prior to the event.

3. Renter Responsibilities

Renter agrees to:

- Inform vendors and event participants of Kora Shrine Temple's animal policy.
- Ensure any Service Animal remains under the control of its handler at all times.
- Ensure handlers clean up after their animals.
- Accept financial responsibility for any damage caused by animals brought by the Renter, guests, vendors, or invitees.

4. Removal of Animal

Kora Shrine Temple may require removal of any animal, including a Service Animal, if:

- The animal is out of control and effective action is not taken to control it;
- The animal is not housebroken;
- The animal poses a direct threat to the health or safety of others.

If removal of a Service Animal is required, the individual will be offered the opportunity to remain without the animal.

5. Indemnification

To the extent permitted by law, Renter agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Kora Shrine Temple from claims, damages, or liabilities arising from animals brought to the event by Renter, guests, vendors, or invitees.
